Early Childhood Education

Childcare remains one of the cornerstones of La Casa's work in the community. To meet the need for quality preschool education in our underserved community, in 1999 La Casa shifted from daycare to a Board of Education-certified pre-kindergarten program. Today the Early Childhood Education Division has three state-of-the-art sites serving 240 Newark students. Staffed by certified teachers using the High Scope curriculum, the program provides free, quality bilingual education and related services to children ages three and four.

Services for Youth and Families

Cultivating and enriching Newark's youth is central to La Casa's mission. Through the Youth and Family Services Division young students between the ages of five and seventeen participate in afterschool and summer programs that provide a stable and motivating environment for learning, recreation and leadership development.

Personal Development

The Personal Development Division and Hispanic Women's Resource Center have emerged as leading statewide resources for occupational training and job development geared toward publicly assisted adults and recent immigrants. Through GED and ESL classes, immigration services, and courses on workplace fundamentals, La Casa empowers new immigrants and women toward betterment and self-actualization all the while providing a safe and dependable environment in which to grow.

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program offered through La Casa's Community Improvement Division, serves almost twenty thousand Essex County residents a year and is recognized statewide for its efficiency and quality of services. The Weatherization Assistance Program has assisted thousands of qualified homeowners and tenants assess their home's overall energy efficiency by creating and executing a plan to improve the building shell and heating unit and saving families thousands of dollars on their energy bills.
